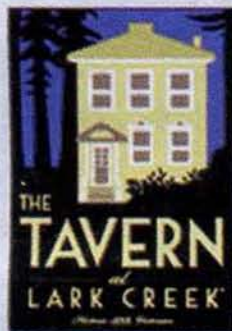

THE TAVERN AT LARK CREEK



If you happen to find yourself across the Golden Gate Bridge one evening, or perhaps a Sunday morning, you should try The Tavern at Lark Creek in Larkspur. Formerly the Lark Creek

Inn, it now represents the next chapter in the life of the historic, circa 1888 Victorian Murphy House. Intended to appeal to diners looking for value, fun and great ambiance, The Tavern seeks to capture the more casual feel diners look for today. High-backed cherry chairs and period oak tables surround a grand Carrera marble-topped table beneath a giant skylight, providing lots of great seating options for



parties both large and small in the main dining room. Oak tables fill the cozy bar, which offers artisanal cocktails and wines from our proprietary tap system. The wood oven has been renewed, along with the garden. A dramatic lighted display case in the entryway welcomes diners. Chef Aaron Wright's menu focuses on variety and value, while sticking to farm-to-table sensibilities.

**For the Fall Season, Chef Wright will be celebrating with a "Pumpkin Festival" menu where you can enjoy items such as Golden Acorn Squash Bisque, Autumn Squash Salad and Autumn Squash Ratatouille.**
